**Description:** All Brevard County Public School teachers are invited to apply for classroom grant funding to support initiatives and programs in support of student achievement and improving teaching quality. The intention of Brevard Schools Foundation is to encourage teachers to implement innovative projects in areas of need where school budgets fall short or tax dollars cannot be used. These are competitive grants that will be awarded highest to lowest score in each category applied for until the funding runs out. All grants are contingent upon availability of funding. **Eligibility:** Eligible teachers must be current AIAA Educator Associate members actively engaged in kindergarten through grade 12 classroom education prior to receiving a grant.

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### **NEW! Organization: Captain Planet Foundation**

**Description:** The [Captain Planet Foundation](http://www.captainplanet.org) is accepting applications from schools and nonprofit organizations for its Ecotech Grant program, an initiative to support projects that motivate children through science, technology, engineering, and math while challenging them to re-imagine the way their world can be.

Grants of \$2,500 will be awarded to schools or nonprofit organizations for projects that use innovation, nature-based design, and/or technology to address environmental problems in their communities. Projects should integrate environmental education with opportunities for children to solve real-world problems by using science practices and technology to help care for the environment. Projects may replicate successful models or create new and innovative approaches.

**Eligibility:** Applicants must be a school or nonprofit organization based in the United States, while project leaders must be employed at the same school or organization for the duration of the proposed project.

**Amount of Awards:** \$2500
