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New! Dollar General Literacy Foundation

Description: The GroMoreGood Grassroots Grant, a program of The Scotts Miracle-Gro Foundation and KidsGardening, is designed to bring the life-enhancing benefits of gardens to communities across the United States. In 2023, funding will be provided to 160 programs to install new or improve existing youth gardens or greenspaces.

Eligibility: Nonprofit organizations, school districts, universities, government entities, and other tax-exempt organizations in the United States and its territories that serve at least 15 youth are eligible to apply.

Amount of Award: \$500

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National Park Trust: Kids to Parks Day School Grants Program

Description: In celebration of Kids to Parks Day on May 20, 2023, the National Park Trust is offering the Kids to Parks Day School Grants Program, which provides support to under-resourced U.S. schools to help students discover and explore parks, historic sites, public lands, and waters. Funds can be used for distance learning experiences or up to \$1,000 for in-park experiences. All applications must include a stewardship element and a park-themed educational component that focuses on outdoor recreation and healthy lifestyles, environmental education/science, or history. Teachers can submit the application on behalf of their class, but direct student involvement in the application is required. Preference will be given to experiences that take place during May 2023, though exceptions for other spring 2023 dates will be considered. Funding must be used by June 30, 2023.

Eligibility: Title I pre-K through 12 classrooms in the U.S and its territories are eligible to apply

Amount of Award: up to \$500

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KidsGardening: Klorane Botanical Foundation

Description: The Budding Botanist Grant, presented by KidsGardening and the Klorane Botanical Foundation, provides funding to K-12 schools across the United States for school garden programs. In 2022, 20 high-needs schools will receive funding to support the development of new and expansion of existing gardens that teach students about environmental sustainability and the importance of biodiversity

Eligibility: Public, charter, and private K-12 schools demonstrating that at least 40% of their student population qualify for free or reduced-price meals are eligible to apply.

Amount of Award: \$1,000

Description: Thanks to the generosity of Donald Samull, who made a **planned gift** to The Herb Society of America, an herb garden grant program for elementary school classes was established more than a decade ago. These grants ensure that learning about herbs can be part of the curriculum, a resource Mr. Samull — an elementary school teacher — regularly used in his own classroom.

Grants fund the establishment of an herb garden. In addition to plants, the funds may be used for supplies such as soil, plants trays, containers, child or youth sized tools, etc.

Eligibility: Elementary classrooms grades 3-6 with fifteen students or more

Amount of Award: \$300.

National Geographic's COVID-19 Remote Learning Emergency Fund for Educators supports individual educators, or individual educators working in collaboration with other educators or National Geographic Explorers, to design instructional resources that help educators effectively teach in remote or hybrid learning environments. Grants are provided in the subject areas of science, social studies, and geography. Priority is given to educators working in communities that have been particularly hard hit by the pandemic. K-12 teaching professionals worldwide who work directly with students in the classroom are eligible to apply.

Description: The grants are meant to supplement FAITC's *Gardening for Grades*, *Gardening for Nutrition* and *STEMming Up Gardening*, three books that take Florida teachers through the process of developing a school garden, and includes lessons to help teachers use the garden to teach health, science, language arts, math, technology, engineering and other subjects.

The grants will be awarded on a first-come, first-serve basis to those who meet all of the grant requirements. The guidelines for the grant are below. Please note multiple teachers from the same school cannot apply for the grant, only one grant recipient per school.

Eligibility: Certified teachers in Florida engaged in classroom instruction at the pre-kindergarten through 12th grade level who wish to create fruit and vegetable school gardens to enhance students' understanding of agriculture.

Amount of Awards: \$500.
