Florida Eastern Star Grant Program

The Grand Chapter of Florida, Order of the Eastern Star, Charitable Foundation, Inc. (Florida Eastern Star) has developed a program that permits funds to cover tuition only for those accepted in an accredited college, university, community college or vocational institution within the State of Florida. This grant is available to Florida high school seniors, including home-schooled students, graduating in 2024. While grade point average is important, the primary focus of the Florida Eastern Star Grant Program is a student's desire for a career or vocation and a need for these funds.

Tuition to an accredited university, college, junior college, community college or vocational institution within the State of Florida. It is a one-time grant for a one-year period. The amount of the award will be based on the amount available in the Fund. The money is issued for tuition ONLY and does not need to be repaid.

Requirements for submission:

- Florida High School senior graduating in 2025
- Acceptance to the university, college, junior college, community college or vocational institution of choice with the State of Florida
- Submission of a five-paragraph essay on the subject of "What does Freedom of Speech mean to you?"

Fidelity Scholars Program

The Fidelity Scholars Program provides access to education and ongoing support to historically underserved and underrepresented students who want to attend four-year, two-year and certificate academic programs and help prepare them to become the next generation of professionals whose career achievements will allow them to positively impact their lifetime earnings and build generational wealth.

Selected Fidelity Scholars will be part of a prestigious program and will be expected to attend an event their first year where they will meet their Fidelity Mentors, College Success Coach and cohort of other Fidelity Scholars.

Bachelor's degree recipients may be funded for up to four years of study. As a need-based scholarship, the amount of financial support provided will depend on the cost of attendance determined by the college or university in which you are enrolling. The Fidelity Scholarship Program uses a last dollar approach. That means your scholarship funds will only be applied after your family contribution and all other financial aid sources have been granted.

The program is open to historically underserved and underrepresented student ages 16-24 who are permanent residents of Florida, Massachusetts, New Mexico, North Carolina, New Jersey, Texas and the District of Columbia.

- 2.5-3.5 unweighted GPA or GED
- Pell eligible and/or demonstrate financial need
- Attend as an incoming 2025-2026 freshman at a 4-year accredited college or university in the state that you reside
- Student applicants must come from underrepresented populations and historically underserved communities who have faced systemic barriers and challenges to economic mobility. We specifically encourage students from Black, Latino, Native American (with documented tribal affiliation, and underrepresented Asian American/Pacific Islander heritage to apply.

Applicants must first create an account on the UNCF site. [Program Landing Page \(uncf.org\)](https://www.uncf.org) This registration process will take 10 minutes. **For consideration, submit required application materials by January 30 at 11:59PM.** Make sure to complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA). If selected as a finalist, you will be asked to submit your admissions letter and financial aid letter.

Reginald E. Johnson Memorial Scholarship

The Reginald E. Johnson Memorial Scholarship Foundation, Incorporated will award scholarships in May of each year to current graduating high school seniors of Brevard County, Florida.

1. Applicants must be graduating seniors in the **current** school year from a Brevard County School.
2. Applicants must have a demonstrated need for financial assistance.
3. Applicants must be planning to attend an accredited college, university, or technical/trade school.

4. The college, university, or technical/trade school of choice must have accepted an applicant, and the applicant must send his/her official class schedule to the Reginald E. Johnson Memorial Scholarship Foundation, Inc. before funds are forwarded to the school on the applicant's behalf. This must be done each grading period until funds are depleted.

5. Applicants must complete this official application in its entirety; the Application must be typed or hand-printed legibly.

6. Applicants must attach three (3) typed letters of recommendation from three (3) adults, representing three different sources and not related to the applicant. One of the letters must be from the school (i.e., principal, counselor, or teacher)

7. Applicants must attach a **1 PAGE-TYPED** essay on the subject, **"WHAT MOTIVATES ME TO BECOME A GREAT LEADER"**.

8. Applicants **must** attach a current photograph of him/herself.

9. Applicants must ensure a current unofficial transcript is forwarded with the application.

10. Applicants must ensure that the application, along with all other pertinent documents and information, are returned to the Foundation **NO LATER THAN MARCH 14, 2025**

- List chronologically the community service/volunteer activities you performed in the last 2 years to help disabled veterans and/or their families

- Provide an official copy of the most current high school, college or university transcripts. Official transcripts are printed on **official transcript** paper with the high school or college seal, date, and registrar's signature.
- Provide one letter of recommendation from a current or former teacher, academic advisor, and/or administrator. Provide the title, name of the educational institution where they work, phone number, and email address for the person preparing the recommendation.
- Provide a list of volunteer and/or extracurricular activities performed in high school junior year to current date. Provide the organization or school name, the volunteer or extracurricular activities, and the dates of involvement. For example, ABC High School, Student Council Secretary, 2022, President, 2023 or My Town Food Bank, volunteer, 2022-current.
